

## Section 4.0: Summary of Some Offences Related to Hunting in Rondeau Provincial Park

There is one basic rule in Ontario Provincial Parks: *Have respect and consideration for your fellow visitors and the park environment.* The Provincial Parks Act and other legislation governing behaviour in provincial parks, are enforced by Park Wardens, Conservation Officers who are Peace Officers defined under the Criminal Code of Canada and have the same authority as a member of the Ontario Provincial Parks Police Force in a Provincial Park.
